Things learned along the way...

Soon we will hear again, "And this will be a sign for you; you will find the baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." What is the sign? The baby? The swaddling cloth? The manger?

Actually all of it is the sign. A sign for the shepherds certainly so that they would know where to find Jesus. But it is a sign for you and me. "This will be a sign for you, ... a baby." God in the flesh. A human being. The creator has been carried for nine months by His own creation. He who made man was made man.

"This will be a sign for you, ... a baby wrapped in swaddling cloth." Swaddled — Jesus was not merely lying in a manger — he was swaddled. A swaddled baby's arms and legs are restricted and bound tight. God in the flesh swaddled. Limited. Is this what Philippians 2:7 looks like up close "But He emptied Himself by taking the form of a servant ..." Years later He would be bound and restricted on the cross.

Here in the manger — a humble feeding trough is the heart of the Gospel. There in the manger lies hidden, swaddled glory. Power restrained, but revealed in weakness.

However, do not forget, He would be bound a third time —bound with strips of cloth. Remember? "They bound up His body with strips of linen ..." John 19:40.

But on the third day — no longer bound by death, He walked out of the tomb.

In the days to come as our attention is on a baby born in a manger, don't ignore what the baby is wrapped in, for that is the gift as well.
