Exploring Local Missions: Natrona/Brackenridge

St. Luke Lutheran Church has stepped

up its local missions program with a new outreach development undertaking in Natrona/Brackenridge, PA. Along with this effort, Dustin Paulsen has been named Mission Developer and will spearhead the work alongside St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church in Brackenridge.

"Our purpose for putting together this effort is so we can learn about the community, listen to the community, love the community, and lead the community," explains Barry J. Keurulainen, Sr. Pastor of St. Luke Lutheran. "We are going to survey the area to determine the strengths and needs of the Natrona/Brackenridge community. From there, we'll formulate a plan as to how to best meet those needs."

This mission partnership began with a simple letter from St. John's to St. Luke asking if we would consider doing mission work in that area. The idea was intriguing. So, after prayer and discussions with the leadership of the St. Luke congregation, it was decided they would move forward with exploring the area.



Volunteer Clearances: Cutting through the red tape

New state regulations mandate that all adults volunteering within a school, church, event, etc. where they will have direct contact with children must apply for the following:

Report of criminal history from the Pennsylvania State Police and Child Abuse History clearance from the Department of Human Services.

Beginning on July 25th, these clearances will be FREE to all volunteers per a change to the law via Governor Wolf, dismissing the normal \$20 fee for Pennsylvania residents. For more information on this law and volunteering with children please visit the website keepkidssafe.pa.



Backpack Pals Deliver Smiles for Students by Brenda Fett

The level of excitement preparing for the first day of school for many children is second only to Christmas. Early August, the list of suggested school supplies arrives in the mail and off to the store we go with list in hand. First things first: the all-important backpack and it will be filled with treasures such as colorful pencils, unique pens, and eye-catching notebooks. Oh, the decision to be made! Finally, after many backpacks are given due consideration, the perfect one is selected. From the time the backpack is taken home, until the bus is boarded on the first day of school, it will be packed and unpacked, arranged and rearranged many times.

But, unfortunately, this is not the case for all children. For many kids the school supply list gets tucked under the mail and a backpack and new school supplies are far from a reality.

However, St. Luke Lutheran Church and School has been blessed through a \$1500 grant (with matching funds by St. Luke) by the John and Harriet Wiebe Foundation of the Lutheran church—Missouri Synod to provide 100 filled backpacks to 100 children in Butler County and the Greater Pittsburgh Area.

Beginning the weekend of July 11 and 12, members of St. Luke will have the opportunity to take a backpack from church and fill the backpack from an enclosed school supply list. The backpack is then returned to the church/school by August 1. With remaining grant funds each backpack will also be supplied with a children's Arch book and a family devotional book.

Backpacks with supplies will be distributed evenly between Light of Life Mission in Pittsburgh, Unity Lutheran Church in Homewood, and Fishbone Ministries in Butler.

Prayerfully consider your opportunity to help a child begin the new school year not only with a new backpack and school supplies but with hope and love from our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Seibert Professor of Ancient History emeritus at Western Michigan University, a four-term Vice-President of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and a much-published author of both scholarly and popular works. His novels include two historical documentaries: *Pontius Pilate* and *The Flames of Rome*, as well as a theological thriller that became a #1 national bestseller in religious fiction: *A Skeleton in God's Closet*. A sequel, *More Than a Skeleton*, appeared in 2003, and the third in the trilogy, *The Constantine Codex*, in 2011.
